3 Complementary Information

The notes below are provided to supplement the information in the 2022 National Team Selection Policy

- All climbers are expected to be familiar with Sport Climbing Australia and IFSC Rules
- Round 1 will be 1 route World Cup Qualification (flash) format
- Round 2 will be 1 route World Cup Semi-Final (onsight) format.
- Due to limited wall space, routes will be set overlapping and rules will apply
- All climbers will compete in both rounds
- The start order for Round 1 will be randomly generated
- The start order for Round 2 will be reverse order of the rankings from around 1



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- Climbers will be ranked from results across both routes using standard IFSC Lead qualification ranking. See below.
- In the event of a tie, the selectors may choose to add an additional route for the tied competitors
- The top 3 ranked Male and Female climbers will qualify for the Australian Open Team in this discipline. Note: this includes climbers who qualify for the team through their representation at the Tokyo Olympic Games or results in World Cup or World Championships events. *For example, if a climber who has qualified for the Australian Team through being an Olympian or achieving a semi-final position in the past two years, places in the top three at the Selection Event, only 2 other climbers will be offered positions on the team through direct selection.*
- Results from this event will be used to determine each athlete's team ranking. If the number of athletes wishing to compete in an event exceeds the maximum number of competitors allowed for a given category at a given event, team members may be selected based on their team ranking.
- As paraclimbers are competing in different classifications, a qualifying top three will be determined for each classification based on the athletes' expected classifications.

4 IFSC Lead Qualification Ranking calculation from IFSC Rules 2022

7.23 Qualification Ranking:

A) Any competitor who fails or is ineligible to start both routes in their Starting Group will be unranked in the round and their result marked Did Not Start or with another appropriate IRM.

B) Each competitor starting at least one route in the Qualification round shall be awarded ranking points for each Qualification route equal to their fractional ranking on the relevant route.

C) The ranking of competitors within their Starting Group will be calculated in ascending order of the Qualification Points awarded to each competitor (i.e. lower Qualification Points is better) according to the following formula

$$QP = \sqrt{P1 * P2}$$

where:

QP = Qualification Points, rounded to three (3) decimal places. P1 = Ranking points on first route.

P2 = Ranking points on the second route.

D) points data presented on the Official Results shall be presented rounded to two (2) decimal places.
